



HERE ARE YOUR LOCAL RULES FOR YOUR CHRISTMAS DINNER

1. All food plates are to be played "down" on the tables, no preferred lies or seating with plates in front of the TV.
 2. Fruit cakes are Ground under Repair.
 3. Any obstacles between you and the ham, such as gravy or mashed potatoes, are Temporary Immovable Obstructions.
 4. Dropping food on the floor is a one stroke penalty.
 5. Tips on how to properly carve a ham constitutes advice and is a two strokes penalty.
 6. Eating before all players are served constitutes practice and is a two strokes penalty.
 7. Feeding Fido under the table constitutes assistance and is a two stroke penalty.
 8. Leaving table to watch opening kickoff constitutes slow play and is a two stroke penalty.
 9. Substitution is not allowed. The player may not leave unfinished beer, wine or Coke on the table and change to another beverage in front of the TV. This is a two stroke penalty.
 10. Cranberry sauce is unfit for play and the player may substitute applesauce.
 11. After a huge meal dessert is unplayable and the player may have an Alka Seltzer with a one shot penalty.
 12. Loose impediments, such as parsley may be removed from the mashed potatoes.
 13. If a player grabs a piece of mincemeat pie by mistake and takes a bite, a provisional slice of pie is ok, and the player may get piece of blueberry.
- A player is subject to "Disqualification" if he/she falls asleep in front of the TV after Christmas dinner.
